Welcome to our new Monthly Herald! I hope that as you take in the new layout, you feel good about the presentation, and the space we

have to talk about upcoming events in our church in a way that is attractive and meaningful. Our goal is communicate more effectively what is taking place at Central. There is a lot of information in here, so please take time to read it.

I have to tell you that I feel a real momentum swing in our church; our church's spirit these last weeks has been lifted, to be sure. It started with the Night to Remember that Bill Bethea planned. A lot of people had a great time, and it was fun to just be together for fellowship. We continued that momentum with the 60th Anniversary, and many folks have talked to me, not just about the careful planning and work that went into it, and not just because of the memories that we shared, but about how they were inspired in hearing the stories, that there is still much for us to do as God's people.

And then last week, we affirmed the search committee's recommendation to call Matt Nelson as Associate Pastor of Worship, Youth and Families. Matt is going to be a great addition to the staff at Central, and his gifts and talents will fit well with our church's needs and our sense of God's vision for us.

The momentum of the last few weeks is going to continue. As you can see from the different articles that are here in this issue, we are

not resting on the laurels of these great events, we are letting them serve as a springboard for the next few months. I am very excited about *The Story*, not just for the content as a condensed, chronological Bible, but the opportunities it can create for relationship and unity at Central. Small groups are being formed, which can be a real turning point in the revitalization of a church. And all ages - from preschoolers to senior adults - being on the same page, literally, as we walk through *The Story* and its themes gives us a chance to share a deeper prayer life together, and to be able to talk about our faith journeys together. This is a real opportunity for renewal in our congregation.

I am also excited about the Ministry Summit on cooperative ministry, as we will have the opportunity to work and develop community ministry that is transformative, and which reaches places that existing community ministries are not reaching. But like *The Story*, it will not just be about the content. We will be working across denominational and ethnic lines in ministry together, and will have the chance to be the face of Christ together with other people and churches.

Finally, I am excited about Christival, coming in November. This month-long celebration will serve as a way for us to connect Christian faith and the arts; it will be a chance for us to welcome artists and their families into the church in some unique and meaningful ways; it will be a refreshing way to enhance what we are already doing in worship; and my hope is that it is an opening dialogue of what it would be like to have a regular presence of fine arts in our church. We hope that Christival becomes a yearly celebration in our church.

So I am very excited, not just about the momentum we have built, but also about the new things that we are introducing into our life together. As we go, I believe that you will find things that will inspire you to grow deeper in your Christian journey. Come along with us, and let us journey together! You are needed. We are Central, your place to belong!

Ministry Summit

On October 29th, Central will host, along with Seabreeze United Church, a ministry summit for the Daytona Beach area. In a recent sermon, I mentioned the horrific murders that took place in Emmanuel Church in Charleston, and stated the obvious, that it was an indicator that there is still much work to be done in bridging the gaps that create prejudice. In my sermon, I mentioned that I want our church to play a role in helping to build those bridges. Then recently, through a connection with Diane Welch, I engaged Barbara Loucks, the pastor at Seabreeze, in a conversation about what we might be able to do cooperatively in ministry. Out of that conversation was born an idea that, starting small and expanding, the churches of our area might be able to develop some ministry projects that we can work on together. Combine those two thoughts of building bridges between ethnicities and churches working cooperatively, and you have the idea behind the ministry summit we will be hosting.

Our goal is not to infringe on the good work of Halifax Urban Ministries, or Family Renew, or the FAITH coalition, or other agencies already in place, but rather to find ministries in the gaps, where our churches can work cooperatively to build transformational ministries that provide direct contact with the people we hope to serve. Our goal is to build relationships with churches that are primarily of different denominations and ethnicities; to begin to build trust and support for one another;



Christival

This coming November, we are going to do something new at Central. We are going to invite different artists from the community, across a number of different disciplines, to be a part of our worship during the month. From paint and sketch artists, to sculptors and photographers, to dancers, singers, and handbell ringers, we are going to celebrate the many different expressions of Christian faith in the arts, all centered around the theme of thankfulness. There are three ways that Christival is important. First, it is a way for us to celebrate the different artistic responses people have to encounters with God in the context of worship. Second, Christival is an opportunity for us to cultivate Christian artistic expression in our own people, especially our children and youth. Third, our very first Christival is a way for us to start a dialogue with the arts community about the intersection of faith and the arts, and what connections might be possible in the future. Whether you are an "artsy" person or not, I think we are all moved as we hear and see things that are beautiful and expressive, so I am excited that we can celebrate this in our church, and I think you will be also.
