Sonny's Sayings

For the last several years, many of you know that we have taken an annual mission trip to Open House Ministries in Home-

stead, to provide a VBS to the children that are a part of that ministry. Words cannot describe the impact these trips has had on our people, as well as on the children that are there. But this year a different opportunity was presented to us that we felt compelled to explore.

Many of you remember the youth of First Baptist Church of Mt. Holly who visited us last June and sang in our worship service. They spent a week here helping in some local ministries, connecting with our youth, and helping us to clean up around our grounds. About 3 weeks after their trip, their sanctuary caught on fire, and they were displaced. Well, as the staff began thinking through the trips and opportunities that we wanted to explore this summer, an idea began to develop of doing something reciprocal with that church in the form of a mission trip. They blessed us; we wanted to bless them. While we discussed these thoughts, we also decided that we wanted to really pay attention to being more intentional in our mission and service opportunities around the community. We wanted to be "Central on Mission," not just in faraway places, but also here in the community.

To that end, a plan developed which the deacons and the mission team have adopted. This plan calls for the formation of several crews to be a part of a mission trip to Mt. Holly this year, including older children, youth, and adults of all ages, and it will replace the youth and children's away camps. We will have a hammer-and-nail crew, a yard crew, a cleaning crew, and a nursing home crew. We are aiming for each of these groups to consist of people from different generations, both connected to our church, and from the community. Our goal is to have some practice and training days around the church and at church member's homes to build teamwork and effectiveness this spring, so that we can bring these crews up to Mt. Holly this summer for a mission trip. And then beyond that goal, we are hoping to continue with these crews to do work around the community, so we can literally be the "hands and feet" of Christ in the Daytona Beach area.

While we are there in Mt. Holly, we will build in time for fellowship, devotionals, and worship, so that we can form intergenerational bonds, be reminded of the reason we serve, and grow deeper in our faith while we are on mission. If being on

any of these crews inspires you, we would love to have you be a part. Or if you would like to support this trip financially, that would also be appreciated. But mostly, committing this opportunity to prayer would mean a lot to those who are planning to participate. I am excited about this summer at Central, and look forward to what God has in store for us.

February 5 is Boy Scout Sunday



On February 5 the boys and families in Troop 65 are hosting their 3rd annual Pancake Breakfast in Adams Hall. Funds raised will help the boys attend summer camp, participate in a special overnight visit to Alabama in May, attend and participate in Campo-Rees in the Spring and Fall. Tickets for the breakfast are \$6.

Troop 65 was started in 1947 and is celebrating 70 years guiding boys ages 12 - 18 in positive directions. Currently the troop has 12 young men participating in camping, community services and learning the skills needed to have a bright future.

Last year the troop participated in almost 400 hours of service in the community. Service projects included Scouting for Food, helping with the Tomoka Marathon, participating in family days at the Flea Market, clean-up projects at Central Baptist Church, Trunk 'r Treat and helping to park patrons at the Bel Canto Concerts.

Troop 65 is thankful for our Chartered Organization, Central Baptist Church and looks forward to many more opportunities to grow together in our community.

LINDA'S LOG...

When I think of all the opportunities that lie before us as a church for 2017 I am both humbled and excited. Humbled because we know that none of our work can be accomplished without the action of the Holy Spirit among us and excited because WE get a chance to take action for Christ. We can choose to feel inadequate for these tasks or we can act...doing whatever needs doing. When I was in high school I learned a little poem that has been meaningful to me over time... Perhaps you know it, too: "I am only one, but I am one; I cannot do everything, but I can do something; what I can do, I ought to do and what I ought to do, but the grace of God I will do."

Theologian Richard Rohr says that we are "ONED" in the love of Christ. The "I" [in the poem] changes as you and I are ONE in Christ and as we realize that we are ALL brothers and sisters who can take love actions for the ONES around us. At this writing, we have delivered 40 blankets to the Homeless Assistance Center in less than three days...and we're not finished yet. Food donations to their Bridge of Hope food ministry is an ongoing church-wide project, as well as the group of folks from Central who help prepare and serve a hot meal there each 5th Friday. Intermittently we have walk-up requests for assistance which can sometimes be

met in house and sometimes need to be referred. Our First Sunday special benevolence offering taken at the end of worship for local missional needs is joyfully given and well-spent on these needs. Thank you for making it possible for us to help when someone is about to be evicted or in danger of losing their electric power or desperately in need of a warm coat or emergency food for their family or some other urgent financial crisis.

Because we are "oned" in love, these folks in need are a part of us; they are our brothers and sisters and sons and daughters. There will be opportunities this spring to work both here on our church campus and in area homes and yards developing inter-generational service teams that will truly shine the light of Christ. Sonny has described in his article some of our plans related to this. I hope you'll begin now to consider ways you can serve. Because as the song reminds us, "We are one in the Spirit, we are one in the Lord. And they'll know we are Christian by our love."



The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.... The night was long and troubling for Jim Hitson. The following morning he faced heart surgery. During the evening long-time friend Alvin Smith visited, looking haggard and exhausted. Still each time Jim wakened during that long night, the 23rd Psalm came to mind and comforted him.

"Prayer," emphasized Jim, "is particularly meaningful to me. I know that a lot of things in my life, in business and otherwise, I wouldn't be able to handle without Someone guiding me through them."

Born in Dublin, GA, Jim and his younger brother were raised in the Daytona area where he worked with his dad in the family Texaco Station on what was then called Volusia Avenue (now International Speedway Boulevard). Jim was in the Army when his dad fell ill and was discharged to carry on the family business.

After selling the service station Jim went to work at Peninsula Abstract and Title Company which later merged with Attorneys' Title Services out of Orlando. "It was very interesting work because of all the history in this area." Jim eventually became Regional Manager and retired after thirty years' service.

Jim joined Central in 1962 at the time of his marriage with Tommie Lou, who is a charter member. Over the years he has actively participated in many capacities – deacon, trustee, pastor search committee member and member of Joyce and Jim Page's Serendipity Sunday School class.
