Sonny's Sayings...

Earlier this month, Laura asked me at a deacons' meeting to give a devotion based on the sermon I prepared for April 8, when Sergeant Davin was here in worship. I am very grateful for his presence, as many people were helped by his comments, and I want to thank Anthony McCully for scheduling time with Sergeant Davin at the request of the deacons. On that Sunday, our scripture passage

for the day was Psalm 133, a very short psalm, which says "How good and pleasant it is when brethren (read: God's people) dwell in unity. The writer then goes on to compare just how good it is. It is like oil running down over the beard of Aaron, even over his robe, and like the dew of Mount Hermon. These were images that conveyed God's abundance to them. So the overall theme is that dwelling in unity is one of the greatest things we strive for, and it is a gift from God. There are ideas from this theme that are important for the stage we are in at Central, so I want to share them with you.

First, it is believed by many scholars that the words to this psalm were sung by Jewish people traveling from their villages on the way to Jerusalem and the Temple for annual festivals. It was a traveling song. As people would leave their villages, they would add people to their caravans, because there was safety in numbers from wild animals and thieves. And as they traveled they would sing songs, reminding them of God's faithfulness. And singing these religious songs resulted in communities that shared a common goal: worshipping in the Temple. This was likely one of those songs. It is even possible that Jesus sang this song on the way to the Temple with his parents.

I thought about what that must have been like. With the passing of time, the caravans would be different, because of deaths in the family, or because of the birth of children, or because of the timing of the journey. And this went on for generations. And

while traveling carts or wagons would wear out and have to be replaced, and while people would come and go, the message of the songs would remain the same, and the common goal of worshipping in the temple would remain the same.



That's a pretty good picture of the church, isn't it? Our losses are sad, but

often celebratory, because of lives that have mattered to us. But there are new people that are becoming a part of our caravan; they are joining in to our song, and they share the goal of worshipping and serving together. So as hosts on our caravan, and as generous people, let us welcome them well. For indeed, it is good and pleasant when God's people dwell in unity!

Linda's Log

The strength of any church is a direct result of many factors. We could each list dozens of factors...some similar or

the same and some different. I'd like us to think about one of the factors that is near the top of my list: active participation. The church needs the active participation of every one of its members. When new folks come, they need to be embraced by others in the congregation if they are to ever feel that they "belong" (as our logo claims!) An invitation to gather with others at a Sunday lunch restaurant, an invitation to attend a Sunday school class or week-day activity or an invitation to share your pew are all welcoming, friendly responses to new faces. Worship is about more than singing and praying and listening; those things are catalysts for what comes next: The Relationship!! I believe each of us is responsible for helping new individuals and families get



involved. And we shouldn't wait until folks walk the aisle to actually join the church to welcome them and offer opportunities to grow new friendships. We need to come each week with the goal in mind of welcoming someone new into our friendship circle.

But bringing new folks into active participation can truly only be achieved by members who model that themselves. Members who have grown comfortable simply warming a pew and sharing an offering are being robbed of personal spiritual growth; there's something for each person to do, regardless of age or health status; I believe God expects us to continue to serve in whatever capacity we are able. If I'm not steady on my feet, I can still phone the sick and lonely. If I'm unable to lead a team or committee, or teach a Sunday school class, I may be able to organize a small group or serve ON a team or committee, lending ideas and wisdom and enabling specific prayers which are not gossip because I'm involved in what's happening and know first hand what the needs are. I believe that it's our responsibility to seek and find a place of ACTIVE service.

Although culture and economics may make it possible to retire from gainful employment in one's 50's or 60's, I can't see how any true believer would ever even consider a goal of "retirement" from Kingdom challenges. It may be that the skills and experience derived from one's profession or lifework are precisely the skills that are needed in the church or faith community. It could also be that God wants us to step forward and learn how to do something new! Lifelong learning keeps us sharp! If you are already actively participating, thank you, for your service; if, however, you've been on a "break", it's likely time to find a place of service, even if no one has asked you lately. Being the church that "engages, encourages, and empowers families and individuals to follow Christ" requires action from each of us! I pray that you will respond to the movement of the Spirit and get actively involved; come see me if you need help getting started. It is a privilege to serve God at Central! Serving Him together, "Linda"
