Sonny's Sayings...

Here we are in the heat of summer in Daytona Beach: always, hot, always humid, but always a breeze, with a rain shower in the late afternoon/ evening. Except this summer is certainly different for us at Central. There are several things that are different this

summer: Linda has retired; I have begun my doctoral program in earnest; and we have a new mission statement as a church. So I wanted to give you an update about what is going on with each of those differences, so you will be up to date.

First, I want to offer up a special thank-you to those who have stepped up this summer in the places Linda was normally involved. Darla Petty and Bill Bethea were great chaperones for Kids Passport camp. Ruth Bethea directed, and many others contributed to a great Performing Arts Camp. Alyssa Pokorny has been great with our children during Sunday School, and Leah Pokorny has been holding down our nursery. Because the other areas where Linda was working have volunteers who are helping, I am working with our Personnel committee to look for an interim children's minister that will serve for a limited time while we are figuring out our ministerial staffing needs long-term. This will be a limited-hours, limited time-frame position, but we are searching.

Jim Shoopman (as the deacon chair) and I have, under the advice of our deacon body, begun a conversation with the Center for Congregational Health (CCH) to examine our church's situation and make recommendations regarding our future staffing needs. This consultation will come with a price, and we will bring recommendations to the church (including price and process) before any commitments are made. The CCH is the same organization that helped us to find Richard Phillips, so we have full confidence in their ability to help give us some guidance.

Second, my doctoral program is in full gear. This June, I completed my course on Biblical and Theological foundations. So far, I am doing well. This fall will help to really focus the rest of the program. I will need to decide on a ministry project that will be the subject of my thesis, and I am rolling some ideas around in my head, which I will run by advisor and coach, and will share with you when it is approved. I will be out of town the week of September 9-14 for a course titled, "Project Thesis Workshop 1," and I will do some long-distance coaching around analyzing my ministry.

Third, regarding our new mission statement, I am working with the church council to form a group of people to meet with another church that went with an inclusive mission statement, and which had some success afterwards, to hear from them about the process of educating and preparing their congregation to live into their mission statement. While we will not use everything this church tells us, we want to glean from others who have had success. We are aware that this process will require some education of our church members to help us to live well into this new statement.

All of this to say, that while this an ordinary summer in Daytona Beach, it is not ordinary at Central, but we are doing all we can to be the best church we can be. I hope your August is a good one.

Central's Servants: JEFF REDFEARN

Ministry in Central and Out by Joan Singley Schrysen

Central has always encouraged a dual ministry, both to her members and to the community at large. Jeff Redfearn demonstrates this beautifully. Within the church he assists Sonny with visitation, as needed, and challenges the Pairs and Spares Prayer Class each Sunday to a deeper understanding of Scripture and its relation to their daily lives. Every Thursday afternoon he serves the community as a volunteer chaplain at Advent Hospital, mostly in the ICU and Critical Care Unit.

Born and raised in Daytona, church has always played a large part in Jeff's life. Jeff treasures the silver Communion chalice of a great uncle, a circuit rider in South Carolina.

After undergraduate work in West Palm Beach Jeff and Penny moved back to Daytona while he pondered what to do next. As Sexton at Westside Baptist, he was assigned the job of painting the parsonage. As he worked, he realized "I've got more to offer than this paint brush is going to let me do." He decided to go to seminary, but he was NOT going to be a preacher.

Jeff has always been drawn to service ministry based outside the church. As an undergraduate he did community service with emotionally disturbed children as well as Sunday services at a prison. During his final year at seminary for his required supervised ministry he wanted to serve in the local hospital, but no openings were available. However, the state psychiatric hospital in town offered supervised ministry for student chaplains. Jeff applied and was accepted. His supervised ministry became a summer ministry and then a fulltime job. He served 30 years in that demanding position.

Jeff speaks with great admiration for the tremendous courage he witnessed in some of the patients who wrestled their whole lives with severe mental illness. He treasures three folders of notes from patients or their families thanking him for his help or just for paying attention. He says, "It was rewarding to know that I made a difference with somebody and to know that I was in the right place. It wasn't church, but it was church."

Health issues of both his parents and Penny's mother forced Jeff's retirement and subsequent move to Daytona. Today we are blessed at Central as Jeff lives out the dual ministry of Central, both within the congregation and out in the community.

JEFF REDFEARN is married to our organist, Penny. They have been married 43 years.


